Year III. Leading small group lectures and discussions on Vaginitis. Ten students per 1-hour session per year

for one year.

1997-2009

Year I. Introduction to the patient. Office visit component. Here students observe the patient-physician relationship along with learning how to take a patient's history and perform a basic physical examination. One to two students per visit for five

half-days per year.

1997- present

Year III. Family Medicine Clerkship. Students advance their knowledge and skills in history taking, physical examination and differential diagnosis.

TEACHING (continued):

1999-2009

Year III. Continuity Clinical Clerkship. Here students learn how to manage and follow patients with various diseases. One student visit for one half-day per week

over a six month period.

2011 - present

Year I, II, III. Precepting and supervision of student of The Robert R. Frank Student Free Run Clinic. This Clinic provides care to the uninsured in Detroit.

Residents

1997-2009

Hospital Rounding. Learners through mini-lectures, facilitated discussions, as well as one-on-one discussions learn to apply their knowledge and skills not only in diagnostic capabilities but also with the management of them. Five learners for seven half-days

for six weeks.

1997-2011

Family Medicine Center. All residents are precepted on

various cases. Five haif-days per week. Between two to four residents per half-day. Also included in this groups are OB residents and physician assistant students.

2000-2001

Nursing Home. Family Practice Residents through their longitudinal curriculum become exposed to patients in an Extended Care Facility. One on-one discussions on the management of Chronic Medical Conditions. One to two learners per half-day per year.

2004-2007

Night Float Residents. Learners choose EBM articles based on admission diagnoses for presentation and facilitated discussions. One resident per month per half-hour sessions.

2006-2009

Board Review questions and didactics. Topics and themes are presented. These are then reinforced by a series of related questions. All available residents. Three hours every month.
